In 2013-2014, WCCCD (Wayne County) had more total revenue than Henry Ford, Mott or Schoolcraft and also had more expenditures than Henry Ford, Mott or Schoolcraft.

However, while of Henry Ford, Mott and Schoolcraft all spent more than 90% of their revenue, Wayne County only spent 80% of its revenue.

For Henry Ford, Mott and Schoolcraft, salaries and benefits account for 78-79% of all expenditures while Wayne County spent about 10 percentage points less on salary and benefits.

If this is all that is considered, Wayne County seems like a paragon of fiscal responsibility.

Unfortunately, it seems that this low level of investment leads to adverse consequences.

Henry Ford spends 55% of expenditures on instruction, while Wayne County spends only 38%.

This explains why it only takes Henry Ford 2 actual students to equal a single fiscal year equated student (FYES), but it takes Wayne County 6 to equal one FYES. It also explains why two thirds of Henry Ford's students are from outside the Henry Ford district.

Many of our faculty have been asked by students, "Where else do you teach?" The students do not mean what other WCCCCD campuses, they mean, Henry Ford, Schoolcraft, Oakland or Macomb.

The Wayne County Community College District can increase retention and completion rates by doubling or tripling the number of full-time faculty by promoting part-time faculty to full-time. If WCCCD invested in its faculty, we could double our number of fiscal year equated students by bringing back our students who have gone to other districts.


